This page has been very well written so I must thank you for that. But there's a part that it doesn't seem to work at all, so I'll try to be more detailed. I bought the software as you can see from the link on the product page. I unzip the downloaded.zip archive on my desktop, the extracted folder being "BCD2000" and there are two.exe files: BCD2000.exe and BCD2000-setup.exe. I run the.exe file "BCD2000.exe" and a window opens up with the title "Windows Presentation Foundation and Windows Forms" and there's an "Install" button. I click it, and a message pops up that reads "An installer is running. Please wait until it finishes." The.exe file was started automatically. So I click "OK" on the message window. When I click on the Install button again, it says "An installer is running. Please wait until it finishes." I click on "OK" and nothing happens. The installer keeps on running, but when I click on the Install button a second time, the installer still doesn't finish. I went back to my desktop and checked the main folder where the installer was downloaded to. It was the folder name "BCD2000" again. I tried to start BCD2000 and BCD2000-setup.exe separately to see if they work. I found out that they work separately, but not together, and I'm still not sure why the installer doesn't finish. Any help would be appreciated, I am using Windows 7 64bit on a HP laptop. A: The BCD2000-setup.exe file is the installer of the software. The BCD2000.exe is the executable file, the real software. The BCD2000-setup.exe file was automatically started by Windows when you clicked the "Install" button of the "Windows Presentation Foundation and Windows Forms" window. So, to solve your problem, please start the "Windows Presentation Foundation and Windows Forms" window and wait until the installer finishes. If you have a problem, please post a question about it.

For example, if I have k candies, I could have either $1S$, $2S$ or $3S$ candies. Now, I need to find the number of ways I can arrange these k items in n slots. I would greatly appreciate any assistance. A: If the number of slots is n , then we must remove k items from a bag with n items. This is equivalent to removing $n-k$ items from a bag with $n+k$ items. Hence there are $\binom{n+k}{n-k}$ ways to do this. A: If we have n slots, and n indistinguishable balls, we can fill them in $n!$ ways. But we have k balls that are identical to those n balls, so we can put the k balls in the n slots in $\binom{n}{k}$ ways.
