It's a history of the United States, the country that will soon protect the Chinese regime that is imprisoning over a million Uighur Muslims, and that is murdering this week its ethnic minority allies in Xinjiang. The book is called *The China Price*, and it's by an American diplomat — United States ambassador to China Terry Branstad — who is also, as it happens, President Trump's favorite Republican. The book's main thesis is that China is simply too strong for its own good. "If China is allowed to continue on its present course," writes Branstad, "it will be the dominant world power in coming decades," with a capacity to dominate the global economy, and the global security environment as well. Thus, the United States needs to be less weak in negotiations with a regime that wants a world in which there is only one superpower, and to "resist" China's dominance. To Branstad, this means we have to push back against China's proposed free-trade agreement with the 12-country Trans-Pacific Partnership (which President Trump pulled the United States out of earlier this month), and the New Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (which Trump is also tearing up). He argues that America needs to block China's expansionist ambitions, and mount a "strategic pivot" away from Beijing. China is such a threat, and so strong, that the United States needs to be far more willing to use military force in order to stop China from ever reaching the position of world-dominance. Trump's trade wars with China — and his threat to send U.S. warships and aircraft carriers to the South China Sea — are all bluster; he knows that, at best, they can't possibly hurt China's economy. Trump also knows, as the Wall Street Journal recently reported, that China may be able to easily defeat any American military blockade in the South China Sea and elsewhere. A more significant threat to American hegemony is that China is getting its economy to perform at least as well as ours, and soon. To this end, Trump's Chinese trade
